The Problem: Cancer Related Financial Toxicity (CRFT)

Cancer Related Financial Toxicity refers to the out-of-pocket expenses that patients incur during and after cancer treatment. It can affect quality of life and even prevent patients from receiving their cancer treatment. This is where the Hands for Holly Memorial Fund plays a critical role. We believe that families caring for their child should focus their energy on their loved one and less on where to find the money to keep the lights on. Here are some stats to consider:

Research shows that financial issues are the second most frequent source of distress identified by cancer patients.



37% cut back on groceries



36% deplete their savings



24% borrow against their retirements



86% of cancer survivors reporting serious financial burden had health insurance



Cancer patients are **2.65** times more likely to go bankrupt than people without cancer



Those experiencing bankruptcy are **80%** more likely to die from any cause than others with cancer

One Solution: Hands for Holly Memorial Fund

Hands for Holly is a 501(c)3 charity that was co-founded by 14-year old Holly Wade as she was battling brain cancer. Hands for Holly's mission is to provide financial assistance to families in need caring for a child with cancer. Our vision is to eliminate Cancer Related Financial Toxicity (CRFT) by providing a continuum of assistance for families with cancer through direct financial assistance and access to financial planning and education.

OUR SERVICES

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Hands for Holly provides our hospital partners throughout the Carolinas with an annual budget for financial assistance for essential expenses not covered by insurance (housing, utilities, transportation, food, etc.). Social workers within our partner hospitals assess the financial needs of patients, provide receipts for expenses, and request a check be paid directly to the creditor. In addition, Hands for Holly provides financial assistance directly to families outside our hospital partners.

In 2019, Hands for Holly helped over 325 people in families battling childhood cancer with an average family grant of \$1,400.

FINANCIAL PLANNING

In 2019, Hands for Holly established a partnership to incorporate the early intervention service of financial planning. This service pairs cancer patients and their families with pro bono financial planners to help them manage cash flow and debt during cancer treatment. Families are referred to the program by social workers and utilize a digital hub that matches patients and families with certified financial planning professionals.

EDUCATION & AWARENESS In 2019, Hands for Holly collaborated with partner organizations to provide families battling cancer with a Financial Handbook. This tool helps social workers facilitate necessary conversations with newly diagnosed families to help them understand their financial options and plan proactively.

MEET DANIEL

Daniel is an 8-year-old boy diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma in July 2019. At the time, he had an intact family including his mom, Debbie, his step-dad, 2 sisters, and 3 step-siblings.

His mom stopped working at the beginning of his diagnosis. Throughout the course of treatment, Debbie became a single mom. She is now faced with balancing Daniel's treatment demands and providing for her three children.

Hands for Holly quickly responded to the needs of Daniel's family and issued funds to cover their rent while their family focuses on Daniel's care.

MEET MCKENNA

Eleven (11) year old McKenna was diagnosed with brain cancer. Like many families faced with this unexpected and critical diagnosis, their focus was steadfast on ensuring McKenna got the best treatment and all of the necessary aides needed.

McKenna's family turned to Hands for Holly to cover their utility bills when finances were falling short. This support allowed her family to continue to be by McKenna's side.

There are so many families just like McKenna's faced with having their electricity shut off due to lost wages while they tend to the needs of their child fighting cancer. More than 50% of these families will file for bankruptcy creating yet another trauma for the family.




